Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dt 30:10-14 / Col 1:15-20 / Lk 10:25-37

I was a little kid when my father taught my mother to use a stick shift. My sister and I sat in the back seat as the car jolted in stops and starts on the vacant parking lot near our house. My father was frustrated. My mother was frustrated and miserable. My sister and I were scared to death.

My first time driving with a clutch was incredibly awkward. The second time too. I couldn't get the feel of it. Worse yet, I couldn't see how I was ever going to get the feel of it. My father, patient, kept me at it. And at one point, it clicked. I knew what a clutch was supposed to feel like.

My wife and I took turns teaching our sons to drive in a huge parking lot in a park. On any Saturday half a dozen or so families bond in that park. The lot is long enough for your car to get into second and even third gear before you hit the grass. Someone set up huge empty metal barrels on the edge of the lot so new drivers can also practice parallel parking without hitting anything that matters.

What has any of this to do with today's readings?

In Deuteronomy, we are reminded that God's Word is very close to us. It's in our heart for us to follow. In Luke, Jesus is asked how to inherit eternal life. He asks the questioner—what do you think? The man knew what to do. Jesus simply said, now go do that.

Colossians reminds us that Christ lives in us—the image of God who created heaven and earth and has power over anything that might test us.

We may not get it at first, but that's who is teaching us.
